
# Why this moment matters

# Trends in Dispute Resolution

#### Dispute activity increasing quickly

- Risk: Rising state complaints add strain and expose system gaps
- Opportunity: Stronger early resolution can build trust and reduce escalation

#### Mediation demand up

- Risk: Growing demand could overwhelm limited mediator capacity
- Opportunity: Mediation offers a scalable, collaborative path to resolution

#### Hearing decisions less common

- **Risk:** Timeliness and staffing shortages risk eroding protections
- Opportunity: Investment in capacity and quality resolution strengthens outcomes

Use conflict to strengthen, not to check boxes


## Traditional compliance model

- Measure outcomes

## Moving innovation forward

- 1. Set a **clear goal** for enhancing dispute resolution or IEP practices in your organization.
- 2. Plan a team discussion to **brainstorm new ways** of fostering collaboration and inclusive communication.
- 3. Pilot an **early intervention strategy**, such as mediation or facilitation, to address issues before escalation.
- **4. Invest in tools or training** that expand language access and equitable participation for all families.
- **5. Commit to tracking impact and sharing lessons** learned to drive continuous improvement and system transformation.

#### Practice

Turning policy change into missiondriven action

#### Safe Learning → Step 1: Look Back

- Recall one corrective action you've been involved in. What was the issue? What fix was chosen?
- Did it protect or strengthen learning and progress?

#### Every Voice → Step 2: Check Impact

- Did the action shift adult practice in a way families or students could see or feel?
- Could a student describe a better experience as a result?

#### Meaningful Change → Step 3: Redesign

- What alternate approach could both correct the issue and change practice?
- How could this support student preparation for life after school?

## Real-world tools and take-aways

#### <u>Mission-alignment worksheet</u>

- Assists teams in aligning decisions and strategies directly with their core mission.
- Includes prompts to clarify who you serve, what you do, and why it matters

#### School data dashboard

- Visualizes attendance, enrollment, student-faculty ratios, results, and budget trends for quick, informed decisionmaking.
- Supports ongoing tracking and team discussion of key outcome indicators for students and families.


#### Continuous improvement sprint template

- Step-by-step structure for rapid, team-based innovation cycles.
- Guides teams to identify barriers, focus on one area, test changes, and review impact in short sprints.
